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How To Bury Your Treasure

Have you plundered a treasure-chest of gold? Are you hiding a handful of diamonds? Do you need somewhere to stash your cash until your pesky pirate pals disappear? It sounds like you need to bury your treasure! Follow these steps and you'll be safe and secure before you know it.

You need to decide where to bury your treasure first. This is where you might

have a problem. Choose a popular island and anybody could find it. However, if an island is a secret, you won't know it's there. The best thing to do is set sail. Keep going until you hit a beach. That will tell you that you are on an island.

Your island must have lots of features. These might be palm trees, mountains, caves or ponds. These are critical. You will need to use these things to help create your map. Don't do this until you've buried the treasure.

When you bury your treasure, you need to think about what will happen when people find it. Other pirates might give up if it's too deep. You want a pirate to find it when their spade hits the wooden chest. They will be even more surprised that way. Let's make this an adventure for them as well! Most pirate ports will sell you a wooden chest for this purpose. Definitely don't bury your gold in a sack.

Everybody knows that X marks the spot. Pirates are very forgetful. You don't want to


be different here. How will you know where to look if your map is covered with lots of strange symbols?

Remember that somebody else might find your map. It's no use just drawing an X. You must send anybody who comes looking on a long-winded tour of the island. Draw a dotted line from the beach to your treasure. Make sure it goes past everything else on the island. It's called a treasure-hunt and not a treasure-find for a reason!

Once you have buried your loot and drawn a map, you have two choices. You can be greedy and keep it to yourself, like a true pirate.

Alternatively, you could roll the map up and put it in a bottle. Nobody has any idea why pirates do this. You can then throw it into the sea for somebody else to find.
