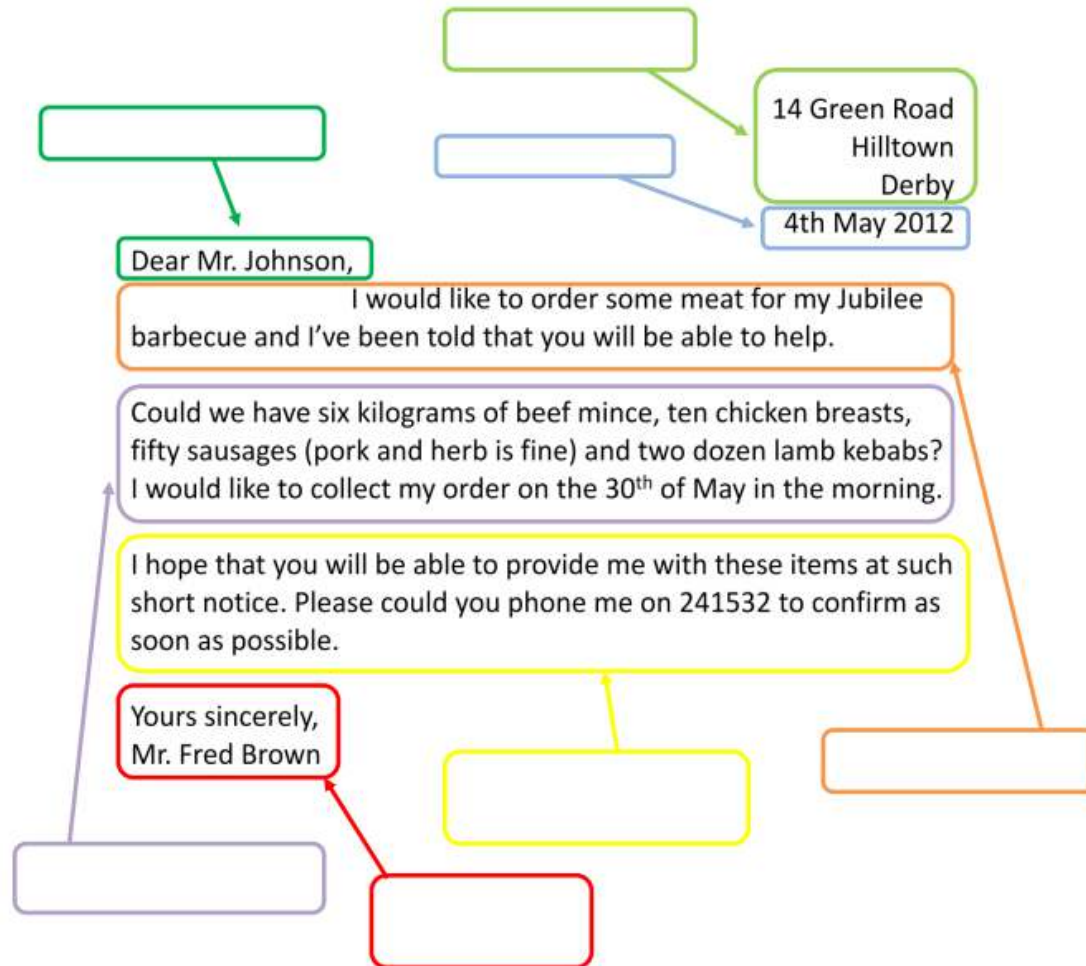

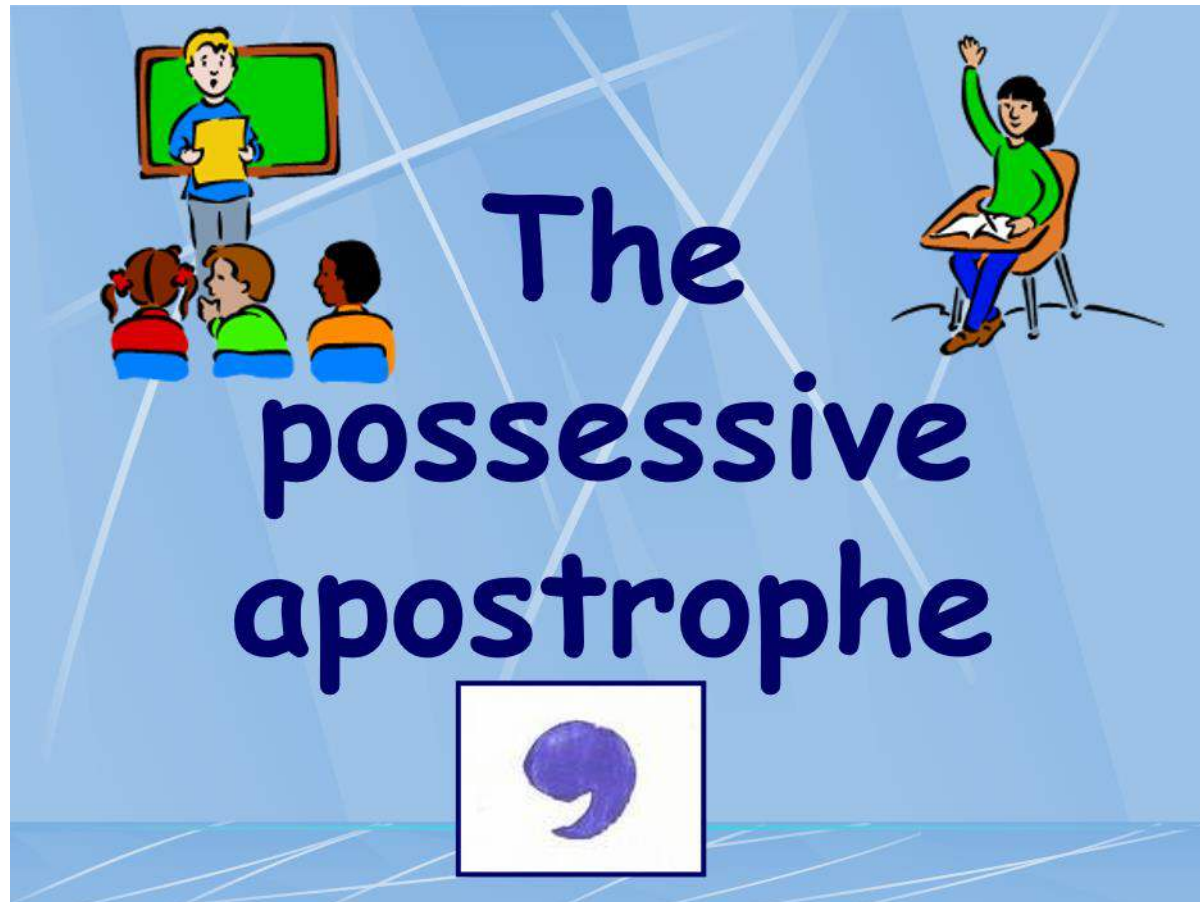


Apostrophes for Possession
