Writing

Practise writing your name.

If you can write your first name perfectly then you might like to practise your surname too.

Which letters of the alphabet do you know? Do you know what sound they make?

Write down the letters you know and try to think of something that begins with that sound.

What was your favourite part of The Three
Little Pigs story and why? Write a sentence and
draw a picture to go with it. Remember to
sound the words out as you write.

Understanding the World

Have a look at different materials around the house, and write a list of what you find, e.g. wood, plastic, glass, metal, water and rock.

Talk about their properties and what the material is used for. Is it waterproof? Is it strong?

Design a house for one of the pigs. What will it look like? What features will it have? What materials will it be made from?
