Season	<u>Information</u>
Advent	It ends on Christmas Eve. The Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary are so called because they recount all the Joys of the "Good News", namely Jesus: • The Annunciation -The angel announces that Jesus is to be born • The Visitation- The baby in Elizabeth's womb leaps for joy when Mary who is pregnant with baby Jesus visits her • The Birth of Jesus [The Nativity] - Jesus is born in a stable in Bethlehem
Christmas	 Christmas is the season in which Jesus' birth is celebrated. December 25th is Christmas day which is recalled in the 3rd Joyful Mystery of the Rosary, the Nativity. During this season, the feast of the Holy Family is also celebrated on December 28^{th.}
Ordinary Time	 Includes all the time during the Church year that does not fall with the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent or Easter. Many great feast days occur during Ordinary Time. Many of these days are recalled in Rosary mysteries. February 11th is the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. Recall how Mary appeared to St. Bernadette and together they prayed the Rosary.
Lent	 This season is before Easter and remembers Jesus' 40 days in the desert where he fasted and prayed. <u>Sorrowful Mysteries</u> of the Rosary should be prayed on Sundays to help you include yourself in the sorrowful season of Lent: Crowning the thorns Carrying the Cross The Crucifixion Holy Week is full of Rosary mysteries. Good Friday remembers Jesus passion and death.
