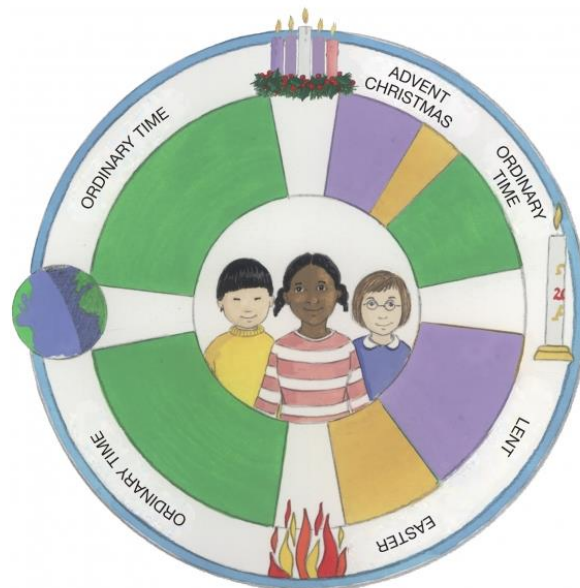
Our RE topic for this half term focuses on 'Community' and the Christian family's journey with Jesus. We will begin with looking at special events in our lives and then begin to reveal important events in the Church's calendar. We will look at how events mark the journey through the seasons of the year as well as how we can help others in their journey.

This week I would like you to explore the Church's Liturgical year.

Task: Look at the diagram of the Liturgical Year (see below). The year of the Church family is marked by special events and seasons. It is called the Liturgical Year. It begins with the first Sunday of Advent and ends with the feast of Christ the King.

It is a calendar of Sundays, feast days and special seasons, which are celebrated during one year. A feast day is a day set aside by the Church family to celebrate an event in the life of Jesus, Mary his mother or a saint.

I would like you to design a Liturgical calendar (see resources for a template) that accurately represents the Church's year using signs, symbols and colors to denote the different seasons and feasts.
