Covid-19

We would like to remind everyone that the Covid-19 virus continues to be around us and impacting on our school and wider community on a daily basis. It is easier, now vaccines have be rolled out to many, to become a little complacent and relaxed around the rules of social distancing, masks and handwashing; however I ask that we all continue to work

together to ensure that these things are followed rigorously enabling us to keep all of our school family, and wider community as safe as possible.

- Wherever possible only 1 adult to drop off and collect their child reducing the amount of people on site

School Crossing Patrol

We previously had a school crossing patrol in place, however when she left, the surveys and figures at the time did not allow for a new crossing patrol to be appointed. We are pleased to share that circumstances have changed, and Mr Robinson, one of our parents, has recently been appointed by Durham County Council as our new school crossing patrol. Please try to make as much use as possible of this safe crossing access and walk to and from school wherever possible.
